

# EXPLORING NORTHERN IRELAND'S HISTORY AND CULTURE

## MONDAY 31 MARCH - FRIDAY 04 APRIL 2025

Join us on our tour of Northern Ireland from our comfortable base in Belfast. The city's architecture reflects the affluence and wealth enjoyed from the linen trade and its status as a major urban centre. These commercial links continue to prosper and following a renaissance of Belfast the city is peaceful once again, and undergoing a radical programme of redevelopment and renovation.

The city's history is inextricably bound with the fortunes of the Harland and Wolff shipyard and the tragic loss of the RMS Titanic. The Titanic Experience, which we will visit, charts the history of the ship from its inception to its demise in the icy waters of the North Atlantic on 15 April 1912. Visits outside the city will include Glenarm Castle and the private estate of Grey Abbey House. We shall also journey up the north Antrim Coastline to the breathtaking Giant's Causeway, a unique configuration of naturally created stone columns.

## MONDAY 31 MARCH 2025

We will depart from our local pick-up point and travel by coach to Southampton Airport where we will check in for our flight with EasyJet to **Belfast**, due to depart at 11.50 and arrive at 13.10. *(Please note that flights are not included in the tour price)*. As the flight straddles the lunch period we advise members plan their own refreshments.

On arrival we will be met by our local coach and travel to **Titanic Belfast**. This exhibition consists of nine galleries retelling the Titanic story from the building of the ship in Belfast in the 1900s through to her tragic end. This self-guided visit features full-scale reconstructions as well as dramatic special effects.

We will continue to the centrally-located **Europa Hotel** where we will check in for 4 nights' bed and breakfast accommodation. After some time to freshen up a **welcome dinner** will be taken this evening in the hotel restaurant.

## TUESDAY 01 APRIL 2025

After breakfast at the hotel we will meet our local guide and begin our morning with a **panoramic coach tour** of Belfast, to include the City Hall, the Parliament Building and the Cathedral Quarter. The City Hall was designed by Alfred Brumwell Thomas and completed in 1906. It has strong connections with the creator of the ship the Titanic, William Pirrie, who was Lord Mayor in 1896 and is now the home of Belfast City Council. The Parliament Building houses the Northern Ireland Assembly, is located in the Stormont area of the city and served as the seat of the Parliament of Northern Ireland from 1932 to 1972. The Cathedral Quarter was formerly the centre of Belfast's trade and warehousing district, which developed directly from the city's linen and shipbuilding industries. After a period of decline in the last century the area has emerged in recent years as Belfast's cultural quarter. Our tour will include Falls Road, Shankill Road and Donegall Street in order to explore the more recent troubled past of Northern Ireland. We will also pass by Crumlin Road Gaol, the only remaining Victorian era prison in Northern Ireland. Built in 1846, it served as a prison for over 150 years.

We will continue to the **Ulster Museum** for a **guided visit**. The Museum's exhibits have evolved over a number of years and today boast an excellent applied arts collection of ceramics, glass, silverware, furniture and wood, costume, textiles and jewellery. The fine arts collection is of significant national and international importance and includes works by Gainsborough, Reynolds and Turner, plus Irish paintings from the late 17<sup>th</sup> century to the present day. 20<sup>th</sup> century and modern art is well represented by both British and foreign artists including Francis Bacon and the sculptor Henry Moore. There will be free time to take lunch at the on-site café or in the nearby Lisburn Road area, where there are numerous restaurants and cafés.

After lunch we will travel by coach to **Mount Stewart House and Gardens** (*National Trust*) for a visit on a free-flow basis. The House has been the home of the Londonderry family since the 18<sup>th</sup> century and its primary exhibit is George Stubbs' famous painting of the race horse 'Hambletonian'. The magnificent gardens were planted in the 1920s by Lady Londonderry and have evolved around a series of 'outdoor rooms'. The mild climate encourages the many rare and unusual plants to thrive, and the gardens offer a variety of colour all year round.

We will return to our hotel for an evening at leisure. Members may wish to visit The Crown Liquor Saloon, located directly opposite the hotel, a historic pub known for its Victorian-era decor. The Cathedral Quarter is also within walking distance and there are numerous restaurants and bars offering traditional Irish music.

## WEDNESDAY 02 APRIL 2025

After breakfast at the hotel we will meet our local guide and coach for the short transfer to the Cathedral Quarter. We will embark on a **street art walking tour**, discovering the contemporary street art murals. Unlike the political murals of the Shankill Road and Falls Road area, these contemporary murals, works by worldwide street artists, have a positive and forward-thinking perspective. Following the tour there will be free time to take lunch in Belfast.

We will travel by coach to **Hillsborough Castle** for a **private guided tour** with a resident guide.

Hillsborough is the official government residence in Northern Ireland and the home of the Secretary of State for Northern Ireland. It is in fact a Georgian mansion house built in the 18<sup>th</sup> century for the Hill family who owned it until 1922 when they sold it to the British Government. In the last 20 years Hillsborough Castle has become a key venue for political events in Northern Ireland and the royal family visit regularly. After the tour there will be some free time to explore the gardens. We will return to our hotel for an evening at leisure with independent arrangements for dinner.

### THURSDAY 03 APRIL 2025

After breakfast at the hotel we will travel by coach to Glenarm for a **guided tour** of **Glenarm Castle** with a resident guide. Built in 1636, it is one of the oldest estates in Northern Ireland. It has been the home of the McDonnell family since the 17<sup>th</sup> century and the current owner is Viscount Dunluce. The Walled Garden, situated in the grounds of the Castle, is one of the oldest gardens in Ireland, dating from the 18<sup>th</sup> century, and is filled with an array of flowers and specimen plants. There will be free time to take lunch prior to departure. *Please be aware that Glenarm's seasonal opening date is subject to weather conditions. Should this visit be unavailable, we reserve the right to change the programme.*

We will rejoin our coach and travel northwards, enjoying the beauty of the North Antrim Coastline en route to the **Giant's Causeway**. The actual causeway is a series of 40,000 stone columns that form steps leading from the foot of the cliffs into the sea. Many of the columns are six sided and some are 40 feet tall. Created during volcanic activity some 60 million years ago, local legend attributes the Causeway to the Irish Giant Fin MacCool who built it to cross the Irish Sea to rival a Scottish challenger! The hues of red sandstone, white chalk, black basalt and blue clay mingle with touches of sea pink to create a unique seascape of outstanding beauty. *Please note that it is a steep walk to and from the causeway. There is a shuttle that provides transport at a small charge (free to National Trust members).*

We will return to our hotel by coach. A **final dinner** will be taken together in a local restaurant.

### FRIDAY 04 APRIL 2025

After breakfast there will be some time at leisure this morning. Members may wish to visit St George's Market, located within walking distance of the hotel, that will be running the 'Friday variety market'. Dating back to 1604, the Friday market contains over 200 stalls selling hot and cold food, antiques, books and crafts.

We will meet our coach and travel to Ards Peninsula for a private visit of **Grey Abbey House**, considered to be one of the finest Georgian Country Houses in Ireland. The Church Hill, to the South of the Abbey ruins, is believed to be one of the first landscaped parks in Ireland. The house contains interesting architectural features including a cantilevered staircase and some watercolour paintings by Lady Charlotte Herbert, the wife of one of the Montgomery family line. A **light lunch** will be served on arrival followed by a **private guided tour** of the house and gardens. We will also visit the **Grey Abbey ruins** that are adjacent to the house. The former Cistercian Priory was founded in 1193 by Affreca, wife of John de Courcy and daughter of Godred Olafsson, King of the Isles.

Late afternoon we will transfer to Belfast Airport for our return flight with EasyJet to Southampton, due to depart at 19.40 and arrive at 20.55. *(Please note that flights are not included in the tour price).* As the flight straddles the dinner period we advise members plan their own refreshments.

We shall be met by our local coach on arrival for the return journey to our original pick-up point.

*N.B. As this tour has been planned many months in advance, the final itinerary may vary slightly from the above.*
